## A non-technical summary of the project

### General description

Net Zero Danışmanlık Anonim Şirketi (Net Zero Türkiye) carries out the project "Safe Water in Uganda" in partnership with its local partner ISAR İç ve Dış Ticaret Anonim Şirketi (ISAR). The project covers 61 boreholes, and the objective of the project is to reduce carbon emissions due to water treatment by drilling boreholes and to improve the living conditions of about 187,000 people living in Eastern Uganda, by providing clean drinking water within a reasonable proximity. According to the GPS data analysis the number of 187,000 people around boreholes within a 1 km distance who are living in our project boundary. Despite this is the maximum number of people who benefits from the boreholes, considering the capacities of 61 boreholes, it is seen that 72,960 number of people benefits at most. To stay conservative, we made our baseline emission calculation using the 72,960 values from the field. While 769 households benefit from each borehole in total, it has been accepted that sufficient water can be served to capped 300 households per well. Since each household has an average of 4 people, the average number of beneficiaries per borehole is calculated as 1200.

Premise numbers are based on GPS data. While calculating the number of households, an area of 0.1 km<sup>2</sup> is taken into account (Water is retrieved at the CWS location (borehole), the water is available within a distance of 1 km as in line with the related methodology). According to the Uganda National Household Survey Report 2019-2020, the average household size in Uganda was estimated at 4.6 persons (UBOS, 2021). By adopting the conservative approach, the number of households was calculated by assuming the average household size of 4.

Water and sanitation are human rights, fundamental to every child and adult. High population growth stressed the water and sanitation services that exist in rural Uganda. According to Water.org, 7 million Ugandans lack access to safe water and 28 million do not have access to improved sanitation facilities (Water.org, 2022).

Unequal access to safe drinking water, make thousands of children sick and at risk of death. Diarrhea alone, one of three major childhood killers in Uganda, kills 33 children every day. Early childhood diarrhea also affects children’s cognitive development and performance at school. Lack of proper sanitation facilities in school also leads to high absenteeism and dropouts, especially for girls. In most cases, children get the disease by drinking unsafe water or coming into contact with contaminated hands that have not been washed with soap. Therefore, in addition to our project, we will also provide hygiene campaigns to inform the people of the region (UNICEF, 2022).

Our survey in the region has shown that those who do not have access to clean water in the region purify the water by boiling it. However, burning charcoal and wood releases carbon emissions and contributes to deforestation. To overcome the above-mentioned

challenges, we will drill new boreholes that are safe for the environment thus reducing the carbon emissions.

Our project has been developed under the Gold Standard as a retroactive project under the energy efficiency/ domestic use scope in line with Community Water Supply Technologies and it will seek to obtain carbon revenues to reinvest in our voluntary emission reduction projects in the region. Thus, we will be able to continue the maintenance and repair processes for the long term. We will also conduct hygiene campaigns and periodically test the quality of the water to ensure we continue to provide clean drinking water.

### Description of the technology

The drilling technology of our project is manual and deep drilling. The depth of our boreholes varies between 15-25 meters. The pump type that used is "India Mark II". The origin of the pumps used in India. Their internal structure is concrete masonry, and their external structure is brick and reinforced concrete. The construction period of drilling boreholes ranges from 1 to 2 months (APEX International, 2022).

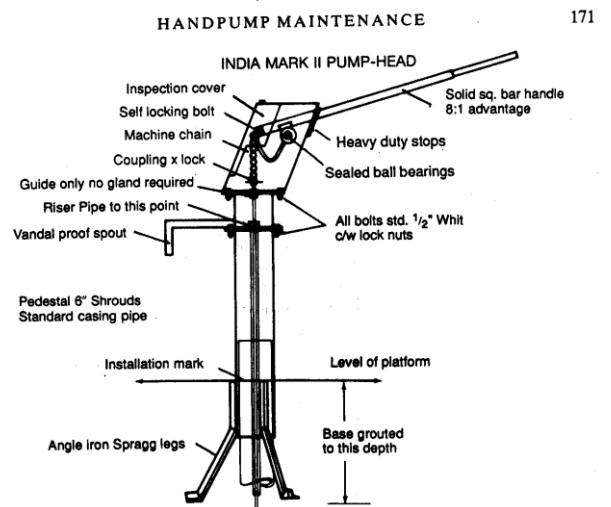


Figure 8.1 The India Mark II pump-head









Figure 1: A borehole from the project site

**Summary of economic, social and environmental impacts of the project**

<b>Environmental impacts</b>		<p><b>SDG 6 - Clean Water and Sanitation</b></p> <p>Through drilling of new boreholes, safe and affordable drinking water have been made accessible to local population. According to the GPS data analysis the number of 187,000 people around boreholes within a 1 km distance who are living in our project boundary. Despite this is the maximum number of people who benefits from the boreholes, considering the capacities of 61 boreholes, it is seen that 72,960 number of people benefits at most. To stay conservative, we made our baseline emission calculation using the 72,960 values from the field. The quantification of clean water distributed will be monitored continuously throughout the project lifetime.</p>
		<p><b>SDG 13 - Climate Action</b></p> <p>Through the drilling of new boreholes, safe water has been made accessible to local population. This has reduced GHGs emissions from boiling unsafe water. Also, the project has deployed zero-emission technology to treat and</p>

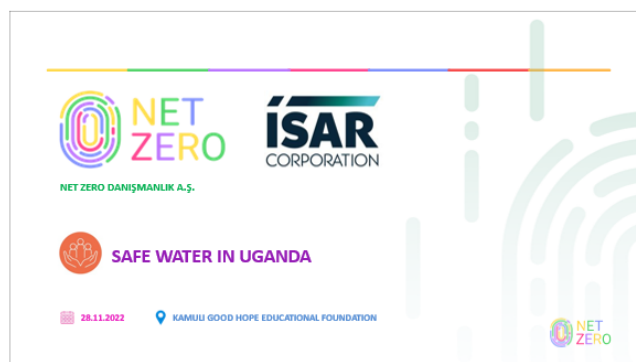
		supply safe drinking water by the technologies available on the ground and indicated by the government.
		<p><b>SDG 15 – Life on Land</b></p> <p>Firewood is the main source of energy for boiling the untreated water. Most of the rural households in the area depend more on the forest for their biomass fuels, causing deforestation problems. When accessing safe water, there has been no need to boil unsafe water. Therefore, this has a positive impact on forest degradation and deforestation related to firewood consumption for boiling purposes in the region.</p>
<b>Social &amp; Economic Impacts</b>		<p><b>SDG 3 – Good Health and Well-being</b></p> <p>Population in the project region do not have access to water within reasonable reach and the water quality does not comply with drinking water quality standards. Therefore, they inevitably expose to water borne diseases. By providing safe water from the borehole, the project reduces the occurrence of water-borne diseases locally. This, in turn, is predicted to decrease the incidence of stomach related illnesses and diarrhoea associated with the consumption of water-borne diseases. In addition, the air quality is better, since fossil fuels are no longer burned in homes.</p>
		<p><b>SDG 5 - Gender Equality</b></p> <p>Women are widely recognised as being principally responsible for collection of natural resources such as firewood and water. In regards to time, women are poorer than men as unpaid domestic duties must be added to their market productive work, making time much more scarce. By ensuring that there is a safe water source at the center of communities, the project have reduced the time poverty of women. Furthermore, boreholes are located in mainly remote rural areas and thus serve marginalised communities.</p>
		<p><b>SDG 8 – Decent Work and Economic Growth</b></p> <p>Through the drilling of new boreholes, maintenance activities have been created temporary and permanent job opportunities for local people. The employees have acquired new skills and knowledge through trainings provided as well.</p>

**Other relevant information to help stakeholders understand the project**

The Expected GHGs emissions reduction of our project is 45,551 tCO<sub>2</sub>eq per year. This figure may vary according to the survey results. However, the amount of emission reduction will be capped at 60,000 tCO<sub>2</sub>eq, due to small scale project requirements.

### B.1.1. Appropriateness of methods

The project targets to the communities in Uganda. An advert of the meeting was published in local newspaper to invite all interested local communities. Local policy makers, representative of local authorities, community leaders, NGOs and governmental organizations related with our project were also invited by e-mail on 28/10/2022.

Adverts were translated into Luganda and posted up in different parts of Uganda. Invitation letters were sent via e-mail in both English and Luganda. In this way, we reached the local people who do not speak English. Please see B.1.2. for the invitation letter. Designated National Authority (Category D), international and local Non-governmental Organizations (Category E) are all accessed by email. Gold Standard representative (Category F) and the Gold Standard NGO supporters (Category G) have been invited by email invitations as well.

### B.1.2. Gender Sensitivity

In some communities, power relations play a part in who may or may not voice an opinion or concern in a meeting. Therefore, excessive representation of a hierarchy or

a specific gender in a physical meeting could be intimidating for stakeholder groups. Therefore, we arranged a single joint meeting involving all stakeholders. However, in focus group session, in order to ensure the active participation of women and to get their opinions, we divided women and men into two separate groups.

Focus Group Session includes a discussion and evaluation on the contribution of our project to the Sustainable Development Goals. We aim to make women's voices heard better by making the focus group session separately for men and women. In this way, we had a more efficient feedback session.

## SECTION C. REPORT OF THE CONSULTATION PROCESS

### **Date of Meeting**

The date of the meeting was 28/11/2022.

### **C.1.1. Justification of why consultation took place after the project start date (retroactive projects only)**

The World Bank's findings show that Africa's water crisis is more pressing than ever. To address water shortages, many African countries have recently been forced to take radical steps. The World Health Organization recommends frequent soap hand washing as the best defense against the coronavirus. It is obvious that maintaining efforts to stop the spread of COVID-19 and potential pandemics depends on making safe water accessible to everyone. However, in Sub-Saharan Africa, roughly 63% of residents in urban areas—the main virus clusters—find it difficult to acquire basic water services and are unable to wash their hands. Approximately 70% to 80% of the diseases in the area are related to the region's poor water quality. For instance, cholera and dysentery are two of the main reasons for infant mortality (World Bank, 2020)

To provide basic sanitary services and safe drinking water to the entire population, \$10–\$15 billion will be required annually. Currently, the industry receives just a relatively small fraction of international aid, with African nations investing little more than 0.5% of their GDP there. In this respect, developing projects in Africa is as urgent as it is necessary (World Bank, n.d.). Therefore, our purpose in developing SDWS projects is to follow the maintenance processes throughout the credit period of the projects and to ensure that the local people gain the co-benefits and meet the water needs, which is more urgent than ever, although we could not perform the baseline survey within the time required (World Bank, 2020).

Our Local Stakeholder Meeting was scheduled for 28/11/2022. When our retroactive project became operational, we had not done a baseline survey yet. For this reason, we wanted to make a sample baseline survey in regions with similar demographic and geographical structure. Although we know this puts our project at risk, for the continuity of the project, we held the Local Stakeholder Consultation Meeting on 28/22/2022.

We have contacted the Gold Standard about whether this is possible on 29/07/2022, they informed us that we need to request clarification. Then we requested a clarification on 11/08/2022 to the Gold Standard. They replied on 25/08/2022 that we should

request deviation for our situation that we stated in the clarification. Afterwards, we also requested a deviation on 05/10/2022, but we didn't directly receive any feedback. We were listed on 17/12/2022 with a FAR for VVB to validate our deviation request and accordingly, this issue was transferred to VVB in the Preliminary Review Form by Gold Standard.

Also, we would like to develop fast and reliable solutions for the needs and mid to long-term projects in Sub-Saharan Africa with a solution partner. For this purpose, we conducted due diligence for our newly planned projects in the regions where we developed retroactive projects. By including retroactive projects in our multi-country PoA or standalone projects, we obtained assets that we can reinvest in the region. This helped us explore much of the positive impact we can have there.

Furthermore, while we were conducting Project Survey for our regular project, we conducted another sample baseline survey and evaluated it, since its demographic and geographical structure is similar to that of our retroactive project. These unclear processes caused us to push the LSC meeting date forward.

In the second part of the presentation Mrs. İrem explained the terms of climate change and GHG emissions. The meaning of the carbon credits to be obtained as a result of the project and what they are used for were explained in detail. In addition, information was given about the rights coming from the carbon credits to be obtained and their ownership.

It was stated that the project was developed under the Gold Standard, and this standard's requirements were explained. Besides summary of likely contributions of project to Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) were explained briefly to the local people.

While making explanations in this section Mr. Juma translated into the local language simultaneously as in the whole presentation.

We talked about summary of the economic, social and environmental impacts of the project as per Safeguarding Principles & Requirements, along with potentially known positive impacts of the Project. Mrs. İrem introduced the principles one by one and Mr. Juma explained the principles' meaning in the local language.

We explained ongoing feedback and input and Gold Standard Continuous Input / Grievance Mechanism Process. We stated that local stakeholders can share their comments and complaints about the project through this registry. We explained that the process is not up to the individual, as the logbook is accessible to everyone involved, including the stakeholder and the project development team.

It was emphasized why hygiene is important, not only cleaning with water, but also cleaning with soap if we have it. In particular, the importance that mothers should take to prevent the disease in their children was underlined.

Mrs. İrem mentioned the importance of keeping hands clean. Also, she explained how they can keep their and their children's hands clean. Mrs. İrem explained that keeping water containers used at home clean will prevent diseases and Mr. Juma translated the presentation.

People were organized into 5 groups, and each of them answered questions in the form.

Therefore, we arranged a single joint meeting involving all stakeholders. However, in focus group session, in order to ensure the active participation of women and to get their opinions, we will divide women and men into two separate groups.

Focus Group Session includes a discussion and evaluation on the contribution of our project to the Sustainable Development Goals. We aim to make women's voices heard better by making the focus group session separately for men and women. In this way,

NET ZERO DANISMANLIK A.Ş. (herein after referred to as Net Zero Türkiye) carries out the project "Safe Water in Uganda" in partnership with its local partner ISAR İÇ VE DIŞ TİCARET ANONİM ŞİRKETİ (herein after referred to as ISAR).

The project covers 61 boreholes and the objective of the project is to reduce carbon emissions due to water treatment by drilling boreholes and to improve the living conditions of about 120,000 people living in Eastern Uganda, by providing clean drinking water within a reasonable proximity. The drilling technology of our project is manual drilling. The depth of our boreholes varies between 15-25 meters. The types of pumps used are "India Mark II" and "Afrabev".

Water and sanitation are human rights, fundamental to every child and adult. High population growth stressed the water and sanitation services that exist in rural Uganda.

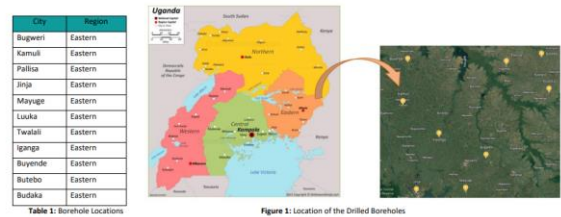
Unequal access to safe drinking water, make thousands of children sick and at risk of death. Diarrhea alone, one of three major childhood killers in Uganda, kills 33 children every day. Early childhood diarrhea also affects children's cognitive development and performance at school. In most cases, children get the disease by drinking unsafe water or coming into contact with contaminated hands that have not been washed with soap. Therefore, in addition to our project, we will also provide hygiene campaigns to inform the people of the region.

Our survey in the region has shown that those who do not have access to clean water in the region purify the water by boiling it. However, burning charcoal and wood releases carbon emissions and contributes to deforestation. To overcome the above-mentioned challenges, we will continue to drill new boreholes that are for the environment thus reducing the carbon emissions.

Our project will be developed under the Gold Standard as a retroactive project in line with Community Water Supply Technologies and it will seek to obtain carbon revenues to reinvest in our voluntary emission reduction projects in the region. Thus, we will be able to continue the maintenance and repair processes for the long term.
